

Celebrations in the Village Chapel

Just as a community's church served as a gathering place to celebrate weddings, baptisms and funerals, the Village Chapel continues these traditions today.

In 2001, the Door County Historical Society celebrated its 75th anniversary with the construction of the Village Chapel, a 3/4 scale model of the first Protestant Church building in Door County. Pastor Andrew M. Iverson founded the Ephraim Moravian Church in 1853. The altar and pastor's chair are copies of originals built by Iverson. The working organ is from the original, historic church.

The elegance of its simply stated interior is reminiscent of a small town church. When a touch of flowers or candles are added, the chapel quickly comes to life. The building has no interior lighting, but has limited access to electricity.



Nestled in the pines along with eight other buildings comprising the Heritage Village at Big Creek, it is a quaint setting to serve those same purposes today. Whether planning a small wedding or a loved one's memorial service, we will help make the day special for you. The Village Chapel easily accommodates 35-45 guests. Although open to the public June through mid-October, we may be able to restrict access for your special occasion.
